

Tefcros Michaelides, has studied Mathematics in Paris, France and holds a PhD in Mathematics (Number Theory) from Pierre et Marie Curie University. He has published original work on the interaction between mathematics and literature from antiquity to the modern era, on the role of history of science in teaching mathematics and on various aspects of mathematical pedagogy. He has collaborated with various newspapers and magazines publishing articles of science popularisation. He is the author of five books:

- *Mathimatika Epikera - A Mathematician's View of Everyday Events* (collection of essays).
- *Pythagorean Crimes* (novel). Translated in English, French, Italian, Spanish, Chinese and Korean.
- *Ahmes, the Son of the Moon* (novel),
- *The Four Colours of Summer* (novel).
- *Symmetry and the Refugee* (novel).

He has also contributed to collective volumes of short stories.

He has translated 28 books from English and French into Greek.

In 2006, the French Government named him "Chevalier dans l'Ordre des Palmes Academiques". He is a co-founder of Thales and Friends, an international non profit organisation investigating relations of Mathematics and Narrative and of The Greek Crime Fiction Club.
